SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT

£1.8 billion for universities & colleges 2018-19

The allocation of £1.8 billion of public funding to individual universities and colleges has been announced for the next academic year.

Universities will share over £1.1 billion of funding while the revenue budget for colleges will increase by 8.3% to nearly £600 million, with the college capital budget also increasing by nearly £30 million to a total of £76.7 million.

The indicative allocations, published by the Scottish Funding Council, also show core student support funding increasing by £3.6 million, with an extra £5.2 million set aside for the implementation of the Independent Review of Student Support. Scottish Government press release.

MODERN APPRENTICESHIPS

Increase in Hospitality Core Skills levels

Core Skills levels in two Hospitality Apprenticeships have been increased following the approval of new Frameworks by MAG (Modern Apprenticeship Group). In the SCQF Level 5 Framework, Communication and Numeracy have risen from 3 to 4; in the SCQF Level 7 Framework, four of the five core skills levels have been increased. More details.

MODERN APPRENTICESHIPS

Early Years apprenticeships increase

A record number of early years apprenticeships are expected to start this year as part of the expansion of free nursery and childcare. The Scottish Government is almost doubling funded childcare from 600 to 1,140 hours by 2020, backed by £243 million in the 2018-19 draft budget alone.

The number of early learning and childcare Modern Apprenticeships has already increased by 22% over the past five years. That figure is set to rise even further following a £1,000 increase in the contribution offered to employers. The number of Foundation Apprenticeships is expected to more than double to more than 700. More details.
